California's Commission on the Status of Women and Girls was established in 1965 to protect and improve opportunities for California women and girls. As an independent, nonpartisan state agency, the Commission provides a statewide perspective to the legislature and other policymakers on issues that affect women and children including inequities in laws, practices and conditions. Areas of focus include gender in the workplace and employment; gender equity in the media; educational needs of women and girls, including STEM; health and safety of women; and girls and women in the military, women veterans and military families.
