California Commission on the Status of Women

Holds Public Hearings on Issues Confronting

Women and Girls

Sacramento, CA – The California Commission on the Status of Women (Commission) will hold a public hearing in Sacramento addressing issues affecting women and girls on Thursday, October 19, 2006 from 1 to 5 p.m. in Room 447 of the State Capitol Building. The Sacramento hearing is the last of three hearings held in different locations throughout the state in September and October.

This is the first time in the Commission's history that hearings are being held to gather information from the public about obstacles and challenges faced by women and girls in California. Holly Mitchell, Chair of the Commission on the Status of Women, said "We are delighted to be able to provide a forum for Californians to voice their opinions and talk about real problems faced by women and girls every day. We look forward to hearing from people throughout the state who have ideas about how we can help to improve the lives of women and girls. The hearings in Los Angeles and Fresno were extremely successful. We are confident the Sacramento hearing will also provide valuable information that will assist us in our ongoing work to achieve equal opportunities for all women." Information from the hearings will help determine the Commission's legislative

agenda and recommendations for administrative action, the state budget, and studies on issues impacting women and girls.
